Exemption/Concessions Extended to Persons with Disabilities for Class VIII

DAVCMC is extending Several Exemptions/Concessions to Spastic, Visually Impaired Physically Handicapped Dyslexic, Autistic and candidates with disabilities as defined in the Persons with Disabilities Act 1995.

Medical Certificate

The medical certificate issued by the following agencies/organizations will be considered for granting concessions to differently abled candidates :

- a) Disability certificate(s) issued by Government hospitals controlled by either the Central or State Government.
- b) Disability certificate(s) issued by Recognized institutes of National level viz National Association for the blind, spastic society of India etc.
- c) Disability certificate(s) issued by Non-Government Organisations/Practitioners registered with Rehabilitation Council of India/Central Government/State Government of the Respective State.

Scribe and Compensatory Time

Spastic, Visually Impaired, Physically Handicapped, Dyslexic, Autistic and candidates with disabilities as defined in the person with disabilities Act 1995 are permitted to use a scribe or allowed compensatory time as given below or both.

For a paper of 3 hours duration 60 minutes.

Autistic candidate is permitted to use the services of a scribe or an adult prompter.

Appointment of Scribe

- A person to be appointed as scribe should not have obtained his/her qualification in the same subject(s) in which candidates shall be appearing for the examination.
- Candidate shall have the discretion of opting for his own scribe and shall have the flexibility in accommodating change in scribe in case of emergency.
- Candidate shall also have the option of meeting the scribe a day before the examination.
- A separate room shall be arranged for the candidate for whom a scribe is allowed Assistant Superintendent shall be appointed to Supervise his/her examination.
- Services of scribe shall be provided free of cost
- Scribe is permissible only in final examination. No Child should ask for scribe during unit test/half yearly examination.

Exemption from third language (Sanskrit/Regional Language)

Exemption from examination in the third language for Class VIII is granted to

- Visually impaired candidates.
- Candidates suffering from speech/hearing defects.
- Dyslexic candidates.
- Candidates with disabilities as defined in the persons with Disabilities Act 1995.

Specific Exemptions/Concessions

The child can be given exemption in any two subjects of choice besides exemption from third language and can study ICT, Music, Musical Instruments/Drawing and Painting. The detailed curriculum of ICT, Music, Musical Instruments and drawing and painting is attached for your ready reference (in case a child opts for exemption in two subjects, then a full time table of five or six period a week should be followed for the opted subjects).

Documents

- a) Medical report from authorize hospital as mentioned above submitting the detailed report of the disability.
- b) A letter of request duly signed by parent giving out details of subjects for which exemption is sought and subjects to be studied in lieu of exempted subjects, which should be forwarded by the Principal of the school to DAVCAE.

Submission of Documents

All documents pertaining to grant of exemption will be submitted by 15th December, 2021. No exemption will be granted after 15th December, 2021.

Exemption request should be forwarded only in genuine cases, as CBSE will not grant exemption easily in Classes IXth to XIIth. Therefore, you are requested to be careful while forwarding exemption letter in Class VIII.
