Ice Breaker Discussion	 i. A class discussion about the qualities of a hero. ii. The teacher may refer to various real life heroes and compare them with the on screen heroes. iii. Students will be encouraged to share their understanding of the word 'courage.'
Methodology of the Activity	 i. The teacher may interact with students about people who have done extremely courageous tasks/ led movements irrespective of their physical weakness. ii.
