NEED OF COMMUNICATION



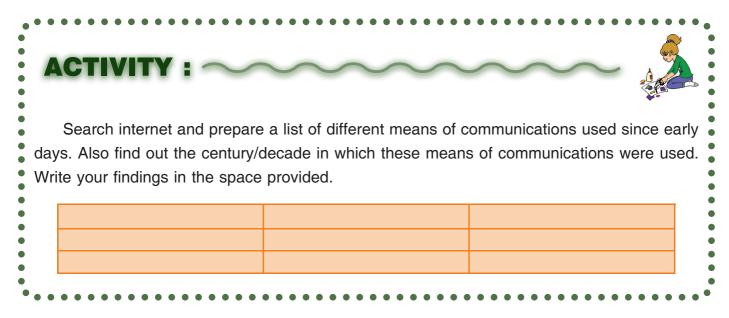
Look at the two images given above. What do they depict?

An army of ants and a swarm of bees.

We actually, don't have to be born as a human being to communicate. All living organisms, be it ants, bees, apes or dolphins communicate with one another thus, forming a network. Communication here means to be able to convey thoughts and ideas, and everything else that needs to be expressed or conveyed.

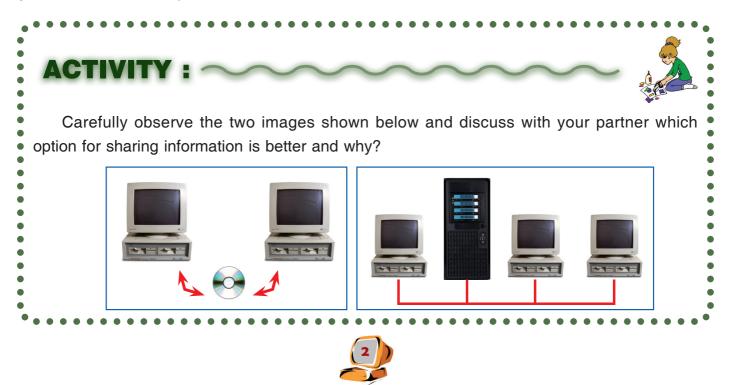
Communication among individuals is not only face-to-face, but it also involves sharing of lots of information. Devices that we use to talk, or to send message from one person to the other are the different modes of communication that we use in our daily life.



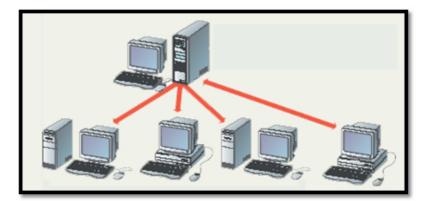


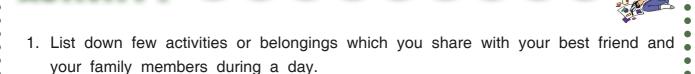
History of communication started with carrier pigeons, horsemen and then letters and telegrams being used for sending messages. Gradually, with the changing time, telephones came into existence. They were very easy to use and also connected us to far off distant locations within no time. Since, telephones were static so mobile phones were invented and came into existence.

Computers have not only simplified but also made the complex mathematical or scientific calculations possible. As we all know, each computer has its own keyboard, mouse, scanner and printer also called **peripheral devices.** If two or more people wish to share the data or information they have to move around with Pen drives, CD's, DVD's etc. However, the need of sending and receiving more and more information among individuals/organisations on the click of a mouse has given birth to the Computer Networks.



A Computer network is a collection of two or more computers connected together in order to communicate and share the data and information.

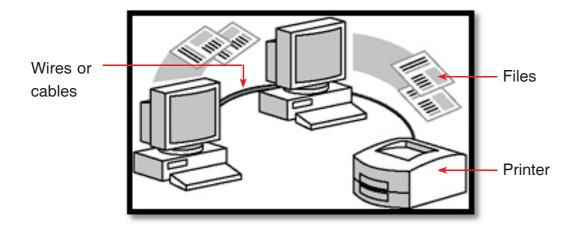

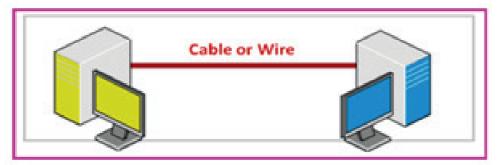




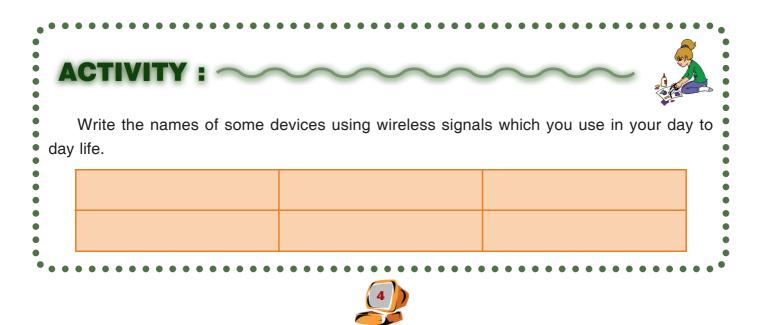
Sharing of resources is very common in our day to day life and we all share some or the other resources almost every day. Similarly, we share computer resources such as **files saved** on the computer, **scanners** and **printers** etc. These resources are shared using **computer networks**.



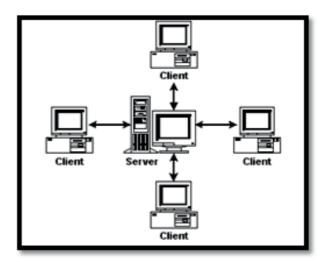
Usually, the connections between computers in a network are made using **physical wires or cables**.



However, some connections are wireless, using radio waves or infrared signals.



When we connect two or more computers together we get a Network. On this network a **central computer (server), acts as the storage location for files** and **applications** that are shared on the network.**Servers store and send data to other computers** and also **control the network access** of the other computers which are referred to as the 'client' computers. Clients are computers that receive and use data from servers.

In order to establish or to connect various devices through network we require,

1. Cables to connect the computers and other peripheral devices to each other.

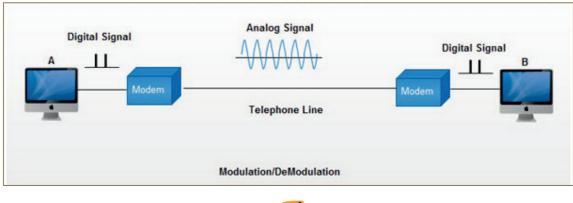


2. Network interface device which is required on each computer, also called a **network interface** card or NIC. This card or device connects the computer to the special device called switch, which in turn links all of the computers on the network together. Each computer on a network must have this network card.

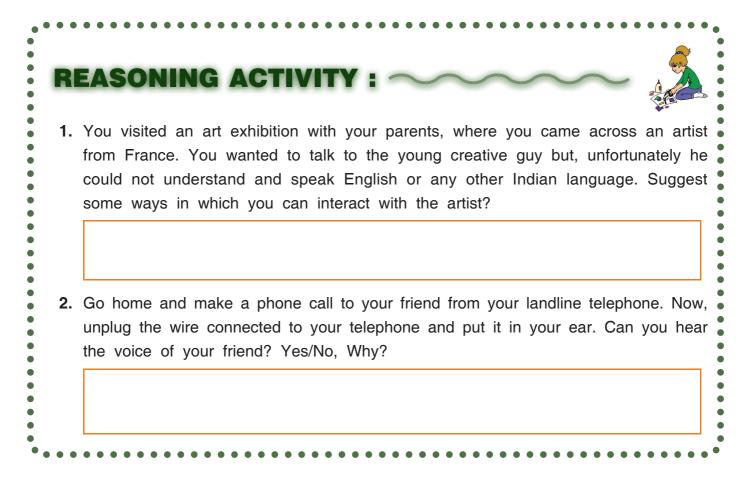
3. A **Switch** is used to connect multiple devices (such as computers, printers, scanners etc.) which need to be connected to each other in a network. A switch can thus connect computers, printers and server, creating a network of shared resources.



4. A Modem is a hardware device which means Modulator – Demodulator. Modems are used for data transfer from one computer network to another computer network through telephone lines. The computer network works in digital mode, while analog technology is used for carrying massages across phone lines. The Modulator converts information from digital mode to analog mode at the transmitting end and demodulator converts the same from analog to digital at receiving end.







We comprehend that in order to communicate with an individual/device who, cannot understand our language/signal, we need an **interpreter** (a person who translates our language to the other person's language and his language to the language we understand).

5. Another device most commonly used in Networking is a **Router** which is used to **tie or join multiple networks together.** For example, we would use a router to connect our networked computers (computers which are already connected to one another by a network) to the Internet and thereby share an Internet connection among many users. The router will act as a courier, **choosing the best route for your information to travel so that you receive it quickly.**

From the above example, we understand that in order to share files (text, images, audio, videos), resources (printer) amongst two or more computers we need a network. A wired network is a network which uses networking cables to connect devices (computers, printers, scanners etc.).

Similarly, the term **Wireless Network** refers to two or more computers communicating using standard network rules, but without the use of cables to connect the computers together. Instead, the computers use wireless radio signals, microwave signals, satellites to send information from one device to the other.

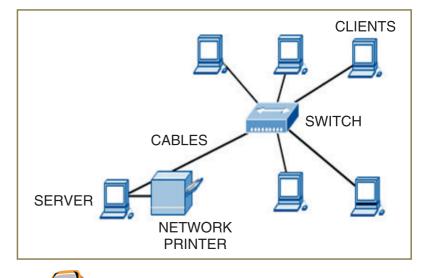

This image represents a Wired Network setup which uses physical cables to transfer data between different devices and computer systems.

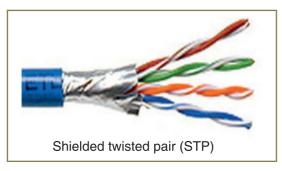
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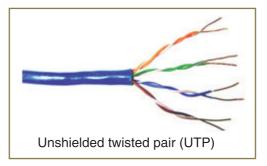
Different types of network cables like **Coaxial cable, Optical fiber cable, Twisted Pair** cables are used depending on the network's requirement.



TWISTED PAIR

The twisted pair cable used for networking is of two types: **shielded and unshielded**. An Ethernet cable is a type of twisted pair. **It is used to connect two network devices directly**, **the device can be a computer**, **switch etc**.





Advantages

- Provides high data transfer speeds and are not very expensive.
- Less power consumption.
- Simple to install.

Disadvantages

- Ethernet cables are difficult to troubleshoot (diagnose the fault).
- **Ethernet card** must be present inside the computer for connecting Ethernet cables.

COAXIAL CABLE

A Co-axial cable consists of a central copper wire surrounded by an outer jacket. It is used by cable TV companies to connect television sets to antennas.



Advantages

- Co-axial cables are inexpensive and can carry data over long distances.
- Co-axial cable has excellent **noise immunity** because of its thick outer covering.
- They are light, flexible, and easy to work with.
- Coaxial cable is more resistant to interference and attenuation (the loss of signal strength) than twisted-pair cables.



Disadvantages

- Cables that use copper conductors can **easily break**.
- Thick coaxial cables do not bend easily and thus, are difficult to install and maintain.

FIBER OPTIC CABLE

An Optical Fiber cable uses **glass threads (fibers)** to transmit data, each of which is capable of transmitting messages in the form of light waves. These network cables are bendable despite being made of glass.



Advantages

- Easy to install being light in weight.
- Provides very high data transmission speed and carries enormous information at once.
- It provides low error rate and ensures secure transmission.

Disadvantages

- * Fragile (can break easily), needs special care to install them.
- **High cost** of installation.

WIRELESS NETWORK TECHNOLOGY

There are many wireless mediums available which are used to share or transmit data and resources in a wireless network for example Infrared, Bluetooth, Radiolink, Microwave, Sattelite link etc.

These mediums can, send or transmit data and resources at different speed and distance. Therefore, a medium should be carefully selected depending upon to what distance and at which speed data or resources are to be transmitted.

NOU KNOW

The world's first wireless computer communication network, known as ALOHAnet, was created in Hawaii by a university professor in 1971. His system used radios and seven computers located across four islands, they communicated with a central computer without the use of phone lines.

BLUETOOTH

- (i) Bluetooth is a wireless technology which uses radio frequencies to transmit information over short distances.
- (ii) It allows communication between several devices at a time.
- (iii) However, it can work only for short distances generally 10 meters or less.



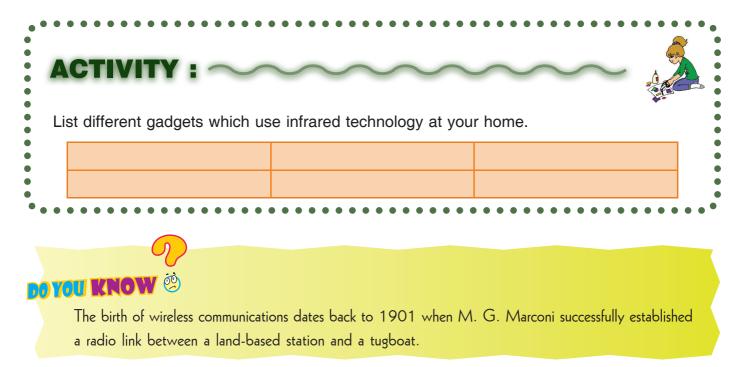

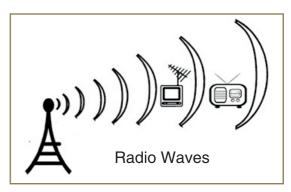
INFRARED WAVES

- (i) They are used for communication between devices that are **not very far from each other** such as in remote controls of your TV sets etc.
- (ii) This type of transmission uses infrared light to communicate between two devices
- (iii) It can work only for short distances and it cannot penetrate walls.
- (iv) It is affected by distance, noise and heat.
- (v) Normally operates between two devices at a time.



RADIO WAVES

- (i) Radio waves are electromagnetic signals that are transmitted by an antenna.
- (ii) They are **Omni-directional waves i.e., they** travel in all the directions from the source.
- (iii) "Radio waves" transmit music, conversations, pictures and data. For example, AM and FM radio, television, cordless telephone, cellular phones, pagers and wireless LAN etc. use radio waves to communicate.





- (iv) Radio waves can travel long distances and can penetrate buildings easily.
 - Transmitter Antenna Radio Waves Receiver Antennas
- (v) However, these signals get easily affected by rains, thunder storms etc.

SATELLITE COMMUNICATION

- (i) <u>Satellite communication</u> is widely used all over the world, allowing users to transmit (send) a signal to any part of the earth's surface.
- (ii) When a signal is sent to a satellite, it either reflects it back to the earth or transmits it to another satellite. This way, it can reach anywhere on the earth.
- (iii) Now a day, satellite transmission is extensively used by major television broadcasting companies.



3G (THIRD GENERATION)

- (i) 3G is the new generation of wireless network technology
- (ii) It has increased the speed of communication
- (iii) The objective of this technology is to provide various **value added services** like video calling, live streaming, mobile internet access, IPTV, etc. on te mobile phones.

4G (FOURTH GENERATION)

- (i) 4G is the successor technology of 3G
- (ii) It offers more bandwidth and services as compared to 3G.
- (iii) The bandwidth is approx..(100 MHz) and transfers data at much higher rates.
- (iv) <u>4G technology</u> is also referred to as "MAGIC".

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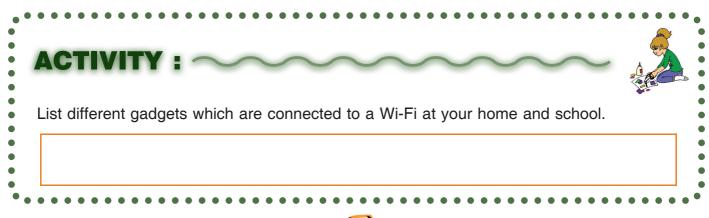
WI-FI

Wi-Fi is the most popular wireless communication technology used within a room or a building for connecting to Internet.

Wi-Fi uses radio waves (RF) to allow two OR more devices to communicate with one another.

This technology is most commonly used to connect devices like computers, tablets and mobile phones to the internet. It typically provides network access for a few hundred feet with a network speed of approximately 54 Mbps.

Wi-Fi networks need to be **password protected** for security purposes to safeguard it from unauthorised users.





WiMAX

- WiMAX (Worldwide Interoperability for Microwave Access) is similar to Wi-Fi.
- (ii) However, it works on a much larger scale and at faster speeds.
- (iii) WiMAX covers greater distance and can cover large cities.
- (iv) WiMAX also has a range of up to 50 km. This wireless technology allows data to be transferred at a rate of 70 Mbps or more.



TYPES OF NETWORK

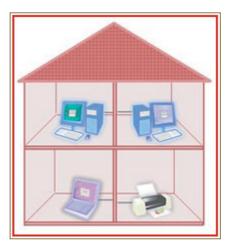
Wired or wireless networks can be classified or divided into various types depending upon **the area covered by the network or size of the network**. A network can be established in a small room or a building or it can be as big as covering the whole city or town.

Depending upon the geographical area covered by a network, it is classified as:

Local Area Networks (LANs):

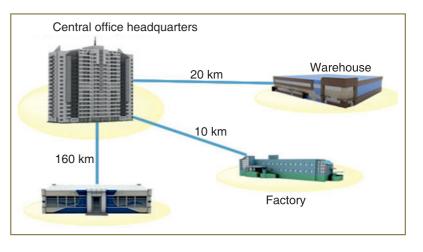
- (i) A Local Area Network (LAN) is a computer network covering a small area like a home, office, or a group of buildings, such as a school or a college.
- (ii) A simple LAN can consist of a **Personal Computer** and a printer or it can connect several computers together.
- (iii) All the connected devices share information (text, graphics, video, audio etc.) with each other.
- (iv) A LAN is limited in size, typically spanning a few hundred metres.
- (v) It is usually fast, with speed from 10 Mbps to 10 Gbps.
- (vi) It requires little wiring, typically a single cable connected to each device.
- (vii) Its set-up involves lower cost as compared to MAN's or WAN's.
- (viii) LAN's can be either wired or wireless.





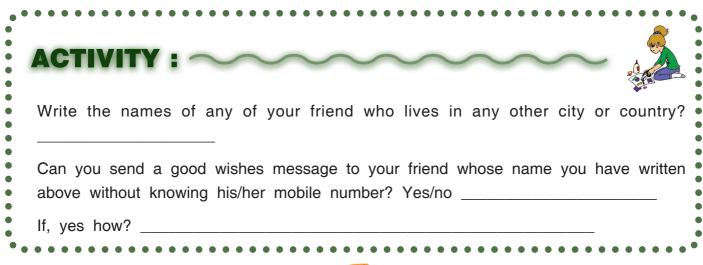
Metropolitan Area Network (MAN):

- (i) A metropolitan area network (MAN) is a computer network covering a **large area** like a campus, corporate offices or a city.
- (ii) It is also used as the interconnection of several local area networks.
- (iii) A MAN is often a high speed network and allows sharing of multiple resources.
- (iv) Examples of MAN: Telephone company network that provides a high speed DSL to customers and cable TV network, Branches of a Nationalised bank in several cities connected together.



Wide Area Networks (WANs):

- (i) A Wide Area Network connects LAN and MAN together.
- (ii) It covers a large geographical area.
- (iii) This network may be located throughout a **country** or **a continent** or even **around the world**.
- (iv) WANs may transmit data over high-speed phone lines or wireless links such as satellites
- (v) Internet and ATM facility are the examples of WANs.





INTERNET

Internet is a global (wide area) <u>network</u> connecting millions of <u>computers</u>.

Internet is often referred to as a Network of Networks or the World Wide Web (WWW).

We can send **text messages**, **images**, **videos** and **audios** to our friends living in any part of the world using WhatsApp or electronic mail. We can also search for any information on the internet and email file attachments. Internet enables even dissimilar computers with different operating systems to communicate with each other using a standard set of protocols (rules) called as **networking protocols**.

Types of Internet Service (Connection)

We are familiar with the names of various service providers in our country like Airtel, Vodafone etc. We can select any type of Internet Service and Service Provider depending upon which **Internet Service Providers (ISPs)**, **serves** the area where services are required and what type of services do they offer.

Some common types of Internet Services (connections) are listed below:

Dial-up:	This is generally the slowest type of Internet connection , and should probably be avoided unless it is the only service available in the area where Internet service is required. Dial-up Internet uses the phone line , thus, landline and the Internet cannot be used at the same time.
DSL:	DSL service uses a broadband connection , which makes it much faster than dial-up. DSL connects to the Internet via phone line but unlike dial-up, we can use the Internet and phone line at the same time.
Cable:	Cable service connects to the Internet via cable TV. It uses a broadband connection and can be faster than both dial-up and DSL service.



Satellite:	A satellite connection also uses broadband but does not require cable or phone lines. It connects to the Internet through the man-made satellites orbiting the Earth. It can be used almost anywhere in the world, but the connection may be affected by weather patterns. Satellite connections are also usually slower than DSL or cable.
3G and 4G:	3G and 4G service is most commonly used with mobile phones, and it connects wirelessly through the ISP's network. However, these types of connections are not always as fast as DSL or cable.

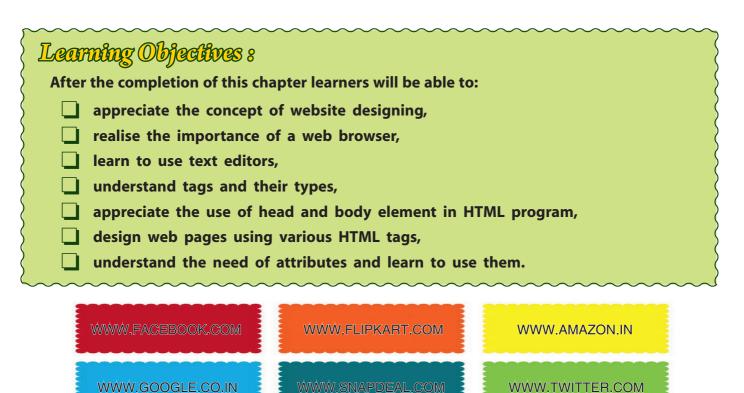

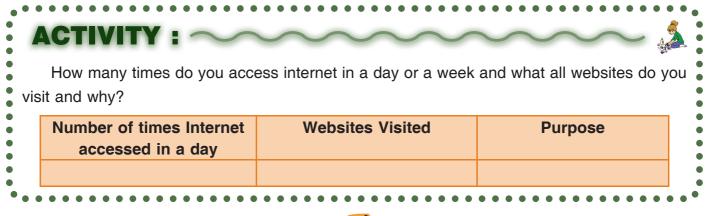

On the webpage of DAV CMC you can find **text**, **videos**, **images** etc. Hence, we can define a <u>WEBSITE</u> as a collection of **text**, **images**, **sounds and videos**.



Web pages can either be **static or dynamic**. Static pages show the same content each time they are viewed. Dynamic pages have content that can change each time they are accessed.

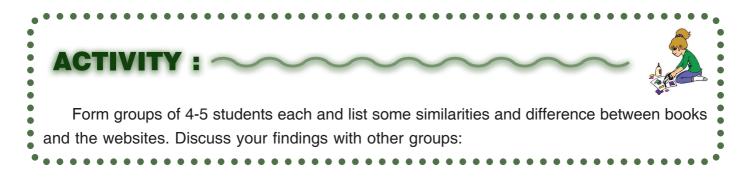
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Next, go to your computer lab and open different websites. What do you notice?



We observe:

- As a book is a collection of number of pages on one topic subject, similarly, a <u>website</u> is a collection of related <u>webpages</u>.
- There are a number of books kept in a Library on different shelves. Similarly, we have a number of websites which are available on the internet hosted on different <u>web servers</u>.
- Every book has its own name, similarly, every website has its own unique address called <u>Uniform Resource Locator</u> (URL).
- All books are written using a language e.g. English, Hindi etc. Similarly, the websites are written (developed) using a special language called <u>Hyper Text Markup Language</u> (HTML).
- Books cover page, provide us with necessary details like Name of the book, Author, Publisher etc. Similarly, websites begin with a <u>Home Page</u>.
- Home Page is the first page on every website which gives us basic details about the information the website contains.



DESIGNING A WEBSITE

In this chapter, we will learn how to design a website. For designing a website we require a:

- 1. Text Editor to type the HTML program.
- 2. A Web Browser to view the result.

We have all used Open Office "Writer" and "MS-Word" the word processing programs. We use "Writer" for typing information, letters paragraphs etc. Similarly,

A <u>text editor</u> is a word processing program that is used to type and edit an HTML program.

Example - Note Pad for Windows and Gedit for Linux.

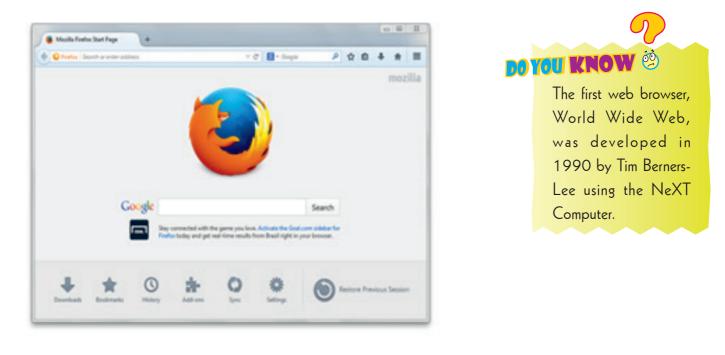
However, the most commonly used html editor is **Notepad**.

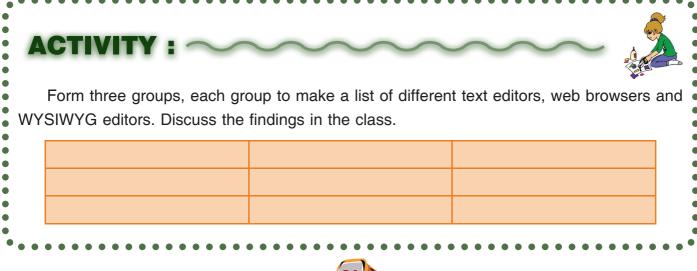




A <u>Web browser</u> is a software which is used to view websites. The website it displays is according to the HTML program written.

Example: MOZILLA FIREFOX







Now, we will learn how to develop an HTML program.

We have already learnt in previous classes that a computer requires instructions to work, which are written by computer programmers using different programming languages.

A program is a collection of instructions that performs a specific task.

An HTML program is written to design webpages, using <u>tags.</u> Tags are **simple commands** which are used to instruct a web browser about how the web page should look like.

HTML TAGS

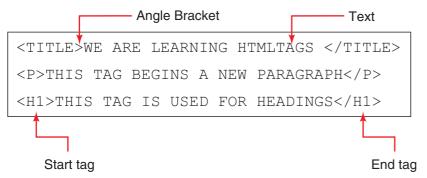
An HTML tag is composed of the name of the element, surrounded by angular brackets.

The HTML tags can be categorised as:

1. Container Tags:

- These tags contain text or other tags.
- They consist of a Start tag and an End tag.
- Every Start tag begins using opening angle brackets <> and the End tag closes using </>>.
- An end tag is always preceded by a forward slash.

Example: <u>Title</u> is an HTML ELEMENT and **<Title>...</Title>** is an HTML TAG.



2. Empty Tags:

- These tags <u>do not contain</u> text or any other tag.
- They <u>do not have</u> an end tag.

**Example :
, <HR>** are empty tags. We never write </BR>.

Let's review the different tags used in HTML program.



SOME CONTAINER TAGS

- A. HTML tag
 - The <html> tag represents the <u>root of an HTML document</u>.
 - The <html> tag is the container for all other HTML elements.
 - In the code given below <html> is the opening tag and
 html> is the closing tag.
 - The standard structure of an HTML document has two sections <u>Head</u> and <u>Body.</u>

B. HEAD tag

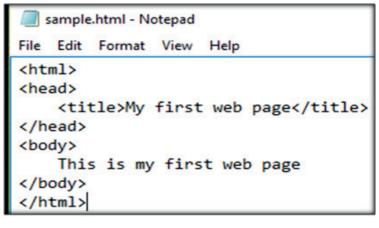
- The <head> tag is a container tag.
- It is the <u>first element</u> inside the HTML tag.
- The <head>tag can include a title for the document.
- It contains <u>no text</u> within itself.

C. TITLE tag

- The <title> tag is used inside the<head> tag to mention the document title.
- The title appears on the top of the webpage i.e. in the Title Bar and not in the actual viewing area.
- It is a container tag.

D. BODY tag

- The <body> tag defines the document's body.
- The <body>tag contains all the contents of an HTML document, such as <u>text</u>, <u>hyperlinks, images, tables</u>, <u>lists</u>, etc.
- There can be only <u>one</u> <body> element in a document.
- It is a container tag.

If we do not save the file properly i.e. Filename followed by the Extension .HTML then we will not get the result/output of the program. Remember the file (in NOTEPAD) is always saved with an extension of .TXT by default.

After typing the program code and saving the file we can view the webpage created, in the browser window. In order to view the web page:

- Click on the File Menu and select the Open option.
- Choose the path where you have saved your HTML document file.
- Click the Open Button and click "OK" in the open dialog box.

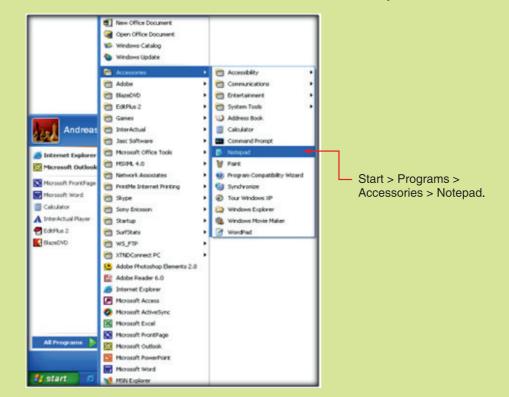

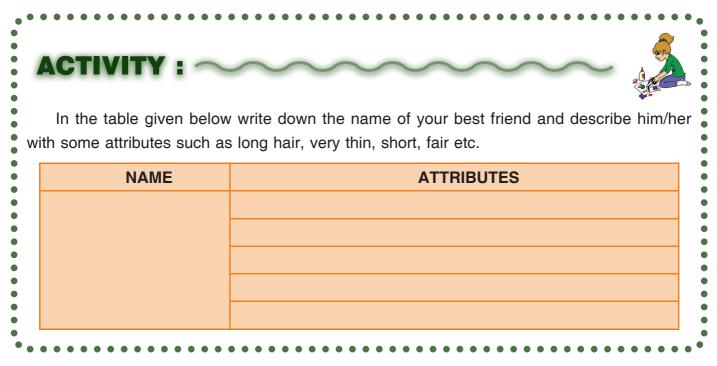

Attributes in the above example, **provides additional information** about your friend. Similarly, **attributes in HTML are properties of the tags**

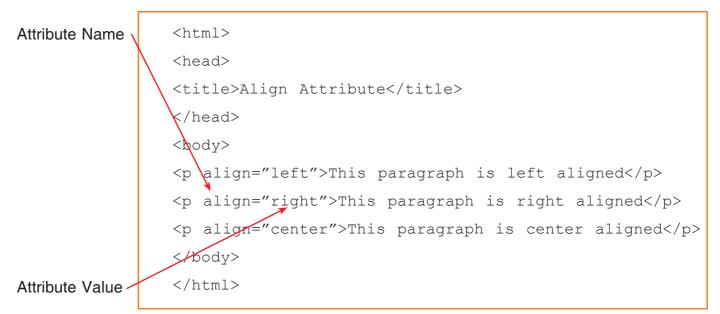
(Example: Align attribute is used to move the text to left) which provides additional information about an element (e.g.: The element P which is used to start a new paragraph).



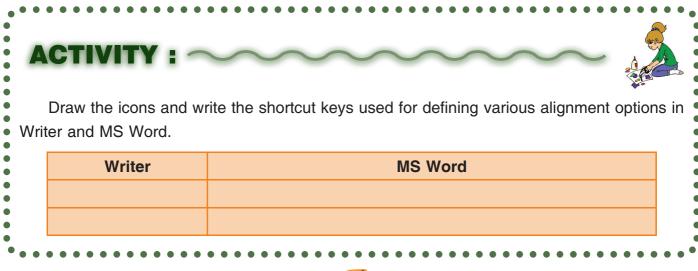
Attributes always appear inside the opening tag and their values inside quotation marks. A tag can have more than one attribute also.

All attributes are made up of two parts: a name and a value:

- The name is the property we want to set. For example, the paragraph element in the previous example carries an attribute whose name is align, which we can use to indicate the alignment of paragraph on the page.
- The value is what we want the value of the property to be set and is always placed within double quotes. The example given below shows three possible values of align attribute of tag left, right and center.



Most word processing programs like Writer, MS-Word etc. give us the facility to change the text alignment. This setting determines how the text is displayed on the page.
