Body Facts

- Our heart is made up of special muscles not found in any other part of the body.
- The brain is the body's main control centre.
- More than two-thirds of the weight of our body is due to the presence of fluids in it.
- Both the eye balls move together. They are always in motion, even during sleep.
- Human nose acts as an air conditioner and air purifier for our body.



Body Signals

- The nutritional level of our body comes down when we feel hungry.
- Sweat keeps the body cool and removes waste.
- We feel thirsty when the water balance in our body gets disturbed due to any activity.
- Blinking helps the eyes to keep them clean and moist.





Our Ecology

Increased destruction and degradation of forests and treelands has disturbed the ecological balance.

Effects

- ▶ It has caused loss of habitat among animals.
- Air pollution has increased the temperature of the atmosphere (global warming).
- Water pollution and too much of fishing has disturbed and affected water animals.
- Wild ass and Gir lion are on the verge of extinction.

Conversation

- Recycling of one tonne of waste paper to make new paper can save 15 trees from being cut down.
- ▶ Use of cycles or pool vehicles for going to work place will save fuel.
- Conversion of waste, such as vegetable peelings, by leaving them in a special container to rot into rich soil compost, will provide organic fertilizers.
- Say 'No to Plastic Bags'. Use alternatives.
- Use 'Eco-friendly products' in household and consumer goods.
- Discourage encroachment/destruction of forests.

Tenzing Norgay

MYSTICAL MOUNTAINEER



- Tenzing Norgay was born in Nepal and is often referred as 'Sherpa Tenzing'.
- On 29 May 1953, Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay became the first to reach the summit of Mt. Everest.
- Both spent 15 minutes after reaching the highest destination at Mt. Everest.
- Tenzing had never used a recorder and camera, so Edmund's voice could not be recorded on Mt. Everest.
- Tenzing received the 'George Medal' from Queen Elizabeth II for his expedition.
- In 1959, Govt. of India awarded him *'Padma Bhushan'*.
